Code of Ethics

- 1. Members should support game conservation programs and most importantly, members must pass on to others, the proper attitudes towards game management all of which are the hallmarks of the sporting shooter.
- 2. Members learn as much as possible about the game pursued, they must be well practiced and know the firearm's capabilities and limitations, shoot safely at all times, obey all shooting range rules as posted.
- 3. Help to keep our shooting range clean and safe by cleaning up after shooting not only their own targets, etc. but also any litter seen on the range.
- 4. Show respect for others and encourage new shooters to acquire knowledge and ethical attitudes relating to game management and skills of safe firearms ownership.
- 5. Members must obey the rules at all times use safe and responsible firearms handling, Transportation laws, diplomatically and observe the rules of safety.
- 6. Undertake to do all in their power to preserve the good image of the Shooting sport and the Association.
- 7. Take the time to share your shooting skills and experiences with novices.
- 8. Wear proper shooting attire, gears, Club shooting uniforms. (Not allowed military uniforms, slippers or sandals).
- 9. Never take advantage of fellow members especially when it comes to personal involvement with family, work and other personal matters inside and outside the range.
- 10. Members must adhere to the following basic ethical requirements. Any breach of these requirements may result in suspension of membership or expulsion from the Association/Club.

Each member of the FPSC-Kuwait shall observe the Code of Ethics and failure to do so could result in loss of membership in the Club. Membership in the club is a privilege and is open for review by the executive at any time. The Executive may propose a special resolution to be voted on at a general, annual general or special Meeting to expel a member who is in breach of this Code of Ethics by giving notice of the special resolution to all Members at least 15 days prior to such meeting. The member who is the subject of such special resolution may attend the meeting to justify why his membership should not be revoked and failing to attend, forfeits his right to be heard.

The special resolution expelling a member requires a 75% majority of members present at such meeting in order to be passed.

Club Members who have reason to believe that another Member or any person in that Member's immediate family have engaged in unlawful or unethical practices or are accused of multiple offences deemed to be unethical or harmful to the Club are to refer the matter to the Club President. If warranted by the circumstances, the President may convene a committee consisting of the President, 2 member of the Executive and 2 Club members at large to consider the facts and circumstances and make recommendations for further action to Club members at a General, Annual General or Special Meeting. Members who are expelled or who are Members Not In Good Standing will not be allowed to enter any of our competitions for that year.
